What Makes a Good Blog Post for Orvis News?

• Informative, engaging, and/or entertaining copy on any aspect of fly fishing, from tackle to travel to family. Funny or emotional stuff works great.

- Written in your own voice, conversational but expert.
- Always include photo(s) and/or video.
- If you'd put it on Facebook, it's worth sending to Phil.

Photo Submissions:

• We don't need hi-res images. Even an iPhone photo is good enough if the subject is compelling.

• *Always include caption info*: anglers' names, locations, fish species, and any relevant info (First time with this species? Father-son trip? Special angling feat of some kind?).

• If you can throw together a 3- to 5-sentence paragraph to give context to the photo, that would be great. If you feel the muse, go ahead and write as much as you want, but a long post isn't necessary.

• Simply email everything to Phil with a relevant subject line.

How-To Submissions:

- Worry about the info, not the writing. Phil will make you sound like a pro.
- Write about very specific subjects, not general rules.
- Readers love "Top X" posts: Top 5 Travel Tips, Top 10 Travel Mistakes, etc.
- Simply email everything to Phil with a relevant subject line.
