Conserving wild steelhead



The bad

- Wild steelhead greatly depleted
- 75% of populations listed under ESA

The good

Still have some great habitat and strong populations

Challenge

 How to sustain and maximize the best remaining populations?





Wild Steelhead Initiative



© Goal

- Abundant, fishable wild steelhead populations in rivers with a high potential to support them
- Science and policy
 - Manage to sustain and rebuild
- Working where steelhead are native in lower-48 and Alaska



Changing how steelhead are managed



- Millions spent on habitat
- However,
 - Few changes in fisheries
 - ...or hatcheries
- Must align management with habitat work to get return on investment


An example of potential: Olympic Peninsula steelhead



Runs are in decline

- Early run timing depleted
- Escapement goals based on old science

No recovery targets



Aligning H's and improving management



- C Lots of high quality habitat
 - Align that investment with management
- Intense fishing pressure
 - Entire run caught-and-released 2-3 times some years
 - Commercial harvest levels 25-40%
- Better manage ourselves as anglers
 - Get more fish on the spawning grounds









Changing sport fishing rules to help wild steelhead



- TU and Wild Steelhead Initiative
 - Worked with anglers and State
 - Mobilized the steelhead army of anglers
- Ban harvest of wild steelhead and rainbow trout
 - 92% in favor
- Ban on bait and barbed hooks
 - 88% in favor
- Ban on fishing from boat in upper Hoh
 - 77% in favor



Why protect rainbow trout too?







Other changes coming to the OP




SONAR

- Improved estimates of run size
- Better accounting = better management

Revisiting escapement goals

- Based on analyses from 1980
- We are developing new models
 - Update escapement goals
 - Set recovery targets






How can we help OP and provide more opportunity?



- Reopen CnR fishery on Skagit River
 - Closed since 2010
 - One of most revered fisheries in PNW
 - Angling opportunity key to conservation
- Run abundance increasing
 - Easily enough for a fishery
- Important fishery for Puget Sound anglers


